DAYLIGHTING OF BUILDINGS: 2500 YEARS OF HISTORY / 20 OF 'REVOLUTION'

PROFESSOR JOHN MARDALJEVIC

The last twenty years have witnessed a marked reassessment of the function and evaluation of natural illumination in buildings. In this lecture, Professor Mardaljevic describes these recent advances using illustrations from a diverse collection of projects carried out over the last two decades. The 'Hambletonian' by George Stubbs, the world's tallest residential building (when completed in 2018), the Smoking Room at Ickworth House, the New York Times Building, an exhibit shown at the Louisiana Museum of Modern Art and the mandatory daylight requirements for schools recently adopted by the (UK) Education Funding Agency all (somehow) help to tell the story.
